PL 15-105 (“Health Care Professions Licensing Act of 2007,” codified at 3 CMC §§ 2201-2236) was enacted into law on November 7, 2007. PL 15-105 contained the following short title and purpose in addition to other amendments and severability and savings provisions:

Section 1. Short Title. This Act may be cited as the "Health Care Professions Licensing Act of 2007."

Section 2. Purpose. The Legislature finds that, as stated in the Act's section on Purpose and Findings, this Act is required to protect the health, safety and welfare of the people of the Commonwealth.

Section 3. Repealer and Re-enactment. 1 CMC §§ 2641-42 and 3 CMC §§ 2201-72 (Public Law 3-30, as amended, the “Medical Practice Act of 1982”) are hereby repealed. The following sections 3 CMC §§ 201 et seq. are enacted as follows: . . .
