

TITLE 10: LOCAL LAWS
DIVISION 2: SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT (TINIAN, ETC.)

§ 20201. Definitions.

In this Act:

- (a) “Office of the Mayor” means the Mayor of Tinian and Aguiguan.
- (b) “Minor” means a person less than 18 years of age.
- (c) “Person” means an individual, including a minor who is a resident of Tinian and who is:
 - (1) A citizen of the United States as defined by United States law or Constitution of the Commonwealth; or
 - (2) Citizen or permanent resident of Tinian as may be defined by law; or
 - (3) Legally admitted into Tinian pursuant to the Compact entered into between the “Freely Associated States” of Micronesia and the United States; or
 - (4) A lawfully employed contract worker who is residing in Tinian for a contract term of not less than one year.
- (d) “Senior citizen” means a person more than 55 years of age.

Commission Comment: Tinian LL 15-2 was enacted on December 29, 2006, and contained the following short title and findings, in addition to severability and savings clause provisions:

Section 1. Short Title. This Act may be cited as the “Tinian Identification Card Program Act of 2006.”

Section 2. Findings. The Tinian Legislative Delegation finds that local banks, stores and other business establishments require proper identification to cash personal, government, company and other checks. The Tinian Legislative Delegation also finds that there are instances when residents are required to provide two forms of identification cards to properly identify themselves. The Tinian Legislative Delegation further finds that the local government identification card could be used to allow U. S. citizens residing on Tinian to enter Guam and other U.S. Territories in lieu of a U.S. Passport in emergency cases.

To this end, the Tinian Legislative Delegation believes that the issuance of this Tinian Identification Card will provide a true and correct identification of a Tinian resident.
