

TITLE 10: LOCAL LAWS
DIVISION 2: SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT (TINIAN, ETC.)

§ 25104. Direction to Exclude.

(a) A copy of the direction in writing given under 10 CMC §§ 25101 or 25103 shall be given to the executive director by the casino operator or other person who given the direction pursuant to 10 CMC § 25105 or the Commonwealth Director of Public Safety, as the case may be.

(b) A direction given under 10 CMC §§ 25101 or 25103 shall remain in force until revoked by the casino operator or the Commonwealth Director of Public Safety, as the case may be.

(c) It is lawful for a casino operator and an employee or agent of a casino operator employed in or acting in connection with the casino and any person acting by the authority of the casino operator, employee or agent to use such force as is reasonably necessary in order to prevent any person who is the subject of a direction under 10 CMC §§ 25101 or 25103 from entering the casino or in order to remove any such person who remains in the casino, provided that he does not do serious bodily injury to such person. In this subsection the term “serious bodily injury” has the meaning assigned to it in 6 CMC § 103(o).

(d) A person who is subject of a direction in writing under 10 CMC §§ 25101 or 25103 shall not enter or remain in the casino to which the direction relates.

(e) A casino operator or employee or agent of a casino operator employed in or acting in connection with the casino shall not allow or suffer any person who to his knowledge is subject of a direction in writing under 10 CMC §§ 25101 or 25103 in respect of that casino to enter or remain in the casino.
