DIVISION 2: SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT (TINIAN, ETC.)

§ 2565. Commission Action Concerning Application; Issuance of License.

(a) The commission, after giving consideration to the recommendation of the executive director and to such other submitted and investigatory material as it thinks fit including, as an applicable case, additional information or material referred to in the proviso to 10 CMC § 2564(a), may, in its absolute discretion, grant the application for a casino key employee license or a casino employee license, or refuse it.

(b) The applicant shall be notified in writing in the prescribed form by the executive director of the decision of the commission.

(c) The decision of the commission is final and conclusive and shall not be appealed against, reviewed, quashed or in any way called in question in any court on any account whatsoever.

(d) The commission may subject the grant of a license to such terms, conditions and restrictions as are considered by it to be necessary in the public interest, and may issue regulations concerning the conditions under which such a license may be granted, revoked or suspended and what fees, if any, shall be paid for such license.

(e) Where the commission grants an application for a casino key employee license or a casino employee license, the executive director shall issue the license under his hand.

(f) The license shall be in the prescribed form for the license in question and shall specify:

- (1) The name of the holder of the license (and show his photograph thereon);
- (2) The authority given to the holder of the license by the license, including the type of work that may be performed by him, and
- (3) Any other prescribed particulars.

(g) The license shall be subject to any terms, conditions and restrictions as referred to in subsection (d) of this section, and to all other terms, condition and restrictions as may be prescribed to be implied in the type of license in question.

(h) In the event of any proposed change in the type of work that may be performed by the holder of a casino key employee license or a casino employee license under his license or in the event of any other change in any circumstance or condition under or in respect of which a license has been issued, the commission, on the matter being referred to it, may approve such amendment of the license as it thinks fit or the issue of a replacement license in lieu of the existing one.

(i) The executive director, being satisfied in such manner as he thinks fit that a casino key employee license or a casino employee license has been destroyed, damaged or lost, may issue to the licensee on payment by him of the prescribed fee a license in substitution for the one destroyed, damaged or lost.
