

TITLE 6: CRIMES AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
DIVISION 1: CRIMES AGAINST THE PERSON

§ 1803. Criminal Mischief.

(a) A person commits the offense of criminal mischief if he or she intentionally or knowingly:

(1) Causes damage to property of another;

(2) Causes another, by deception or threat, to suffer pecuniary or property loss;

(3) Tampers with property of another thereby causing a danger to person or property or causing a substantial interruption or impairment of public communication, transportation, supply of water, power or other public service; or

(4) Discards waste, debris or trash upon land of another or upon any public land not designated as a disposal site.

(b) A person convicted under subsection (a)(1) or (a)(2) of this section may be punished as provided in 6 CMC § 1601(b). A person convicted under subsection (a)(3) or (a)(4) of this section may be punished by imprisonment for not more than six months.
