

**TITLE 6: CRIMES AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE**  
**GENERAL PROVISIONS**

**§ 303. Conspiracy.**

(a) A person commits the offense of conspiracy if, with intent to promote or facilitate the commission of an offense:

(1) The person agrees with one or more other persons that they, or one or more of them, will engage in or solicit the conduct or will cause or solicit the result specified by the definition of the offense; and

(2) That person or another person with whom the person conspired commits an overt act in pursuance of the conspiracy.

(b) If a person conspires to commit a number of offenses, the person is guilty of only one conspiracy if the multiple offenses are the object of the same agreement or continuous conspiratorial relationship.

(c) It is an affirmative defense that the defendant, under circumstances showing a complete and voluntary renunciation of criminal intent, made a reasonable effort to prevent the conduct or result which is the object of the conspiracy.
