**DIVISION 1: DOMESTIC RELATIONS**

**§ 1548. Orders of Support; Authorized; Enforcement.**

If the responding court finds a duty of support, it may order the obligor to furnish support or reimbursement therefor and subject the property of the obligor to the order. Support orders made pursuant to this chapter shall require that payments be made to the clerk of court of the responding state.

The court and Attorney General shall have the same powers and duties to enforce the order as have those of the state in which it was first issued. If enforcement is impossible or cannot be completed in the state in which the order was issued, the Attorney General shall send a certified copy of the order to the Attorney General of any state in which it appears that proceedings to enforce the order would be effective. The Attorney General to whom the certified copy of the order is forwarded shall proceed with enforcement and report the results of the proceedings to the court first issuing the order.
