## A LOCAL BILL FOR AN ACT

To rename the Apinomw Avenue located in the village of Tanapag to the "SSG Wilgene Lieto Road", in honor of the late Staff Sergeant Wilgene Christopher Tudela Lieto of the U.S. Army Reserve, for making the courageous and ultimate sacrifice while unselfishly serving in our mother country's fight to liberate the people of Iraq and defend freedom in Operation Iraqi Freedom.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE THIRD SENATORIAL DISTRICT DELEGATION PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 4, DIVISION 1, TITLE 1 OF THE COMMONWEALTH CODE:

Section 1. Findings. The Third Senatorial District Delegation finds that the late Staff Sergeant Wilgene Christopher Tudela Lieto began his military career when he enlisted in the United States Army Reserve on June 24, 1999, and quickly attained the rank of Sergeant and was subsequently promoted to the rank of Staff Sergeant in recognition of his outstanding performance, commitment, patriotism and dedication for our country's defense and for the fight to protect freedom for all. On July 2004, the late Staff Sergeant Lieto's Company E, 100th Battalion, 442nd Infantry was activated, and subsequently deployed to Iraq to join in our mother country's fight to liberate the people of Iraq under Operation Iraqi Freedom. The Third Senatorial District Delegation also finds that the late Staff Sergeant Wilgene Christopher Tudela Lieto demonstrated unparalleled valor and courage in service to our nation, in order that others may be liberated and enjoy life as free people. The Third Senatorial District Delegation further finds that despite the opportunity to leave the military and the dangers of battle at the end of his military contract, the late Staff Sergeant Wilgene Christopher Tudela Lieto unselfishly chose to re-enlist and continue his tour of duty in Iraq.

On October 31, 2005, the late Staff Sergeant Lieto was killed in action during patrol mission in Balad, Iraq.

The Third Senatorial District Delegation recognizes and appreciates the late Staff Sergeant Wilgene Christopher Tudela Lieto's selfless act of courage, valor, and patriotism. Therefore, it is the intent of the Third Senatorial District Delegation to honor the late Staff Sergeant Wilgene Christopher Tudela Lieto for making the ultimate sacrifice in service of our nation and in defense of freedom by naming a stretch of road after him in the village of Tanapag, where he was born, lived, and grew up in.

Section 2. <u>Street Naming</u>. The stretch of road in Tanapag village immediately south of Tanapag Elementary School, and beginning from Pale Arnold Road heading west and connecting to Chamolinian Drive, now known as Apinomw Avenue, is hereby renamed the "SSG Wilgene Lieto Road" in honor of the brave and courageous late Staff Sergeant Wilgene Christopher Tudela Lieto.

Section 3. Street Renaming. The stretch of the Industrial Drive starting from the traffic light off of Pale Arnold going north past the US Army Reserve facility and ending at the intersection on Bastos Street is hereby renamed the "100<sup>th</sup> Battalion, 422<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Drive" in honor of the brave men and women of the local Army Reserve who serve our country to protect freedom against the on going threat of terrorism.

Section 4. <u>Administering Authority</u>. The Mayor of Saipan is authorized to administer the provisions of this Act.

Section 5. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 6. <u>Savings Clause</u>. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying,

any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or it becoming law without such approval.
