10 Section 3. Prohibition. No obligation, expenditure, agreement or  
11 contract for expenditure of Commonwealth Funds appropriated by this Act  
12 shall be made for any purpose other than the purposes for which the funds  
13 are appropriated and only as authorized by the Director of Public Works  
14 or his designee. No funds appropriated by this Act shall be obligated,  
15 encumbered or otherwise committed after September 30, 1981.

16 Section 4. Reprogramming. No funds appropriated by this Act shall be  
17 reprogrammed or reallocated except pursuant to this section, or as otherwise  
18 provided by law. No employee ceiling limit imposed by this Act may be changed  
19 or reprogrammed except with the approval of the Legislature as provided in this  
20 section. No funds shall be reprogrammed other than to another item in this Act,  
21 except pursuant to a reallocation or change under Article III, Section 15 of  
22 the Constitution. Subject to the restrictions of this Act, the Director, with  
23 the approval of the Governor, may reprogram funds between or among the items  
24 in this Act in any amount that does not increase or decrease the amount of any  
25 such item by more than twenty percent, except that amounts as necessary may be

1 reprogrammed to Item 27 from any item in this Act without restriction. Notice  
2 of such reprogramming shall be reported in writing to the Chairman of the  
3 Committee on Appropriations of **the** House of Representatives and the **Chairman**  
4 of the Committee on Fiscal Affairs of the Senate not later than three working  
5 days after the date the Director **takes** such reprogramming action. If the  
6 reprogramming would result in more than the percent change, cumulative and  
7 in total for the fiscal year, permitted by this section, or requests a change  
8 or reprogramming of any employee ceiling limit imposed by this Act, the  
9 proposal shall be submitted in writing to the two **Chairmen** for approval by the  
10 Legislature before the transfer of funds or other change takes place. Such  
11 reprogramming request shall be considered approved by the Legislature if it  
12 has not been disapproved by either Committee within five calendar days from  
13 the date of its acknowledged official receipt. Either **Committee** may propose  
14 to amend the request. If the other Committee does not agree to such an  
15 amendment within the five-day period, the request shall be considered  
16 disapproved. If the other Committee agrees to the amendment, the request  
17 shall be considered approved as amended, except that the Director may choose  
18 not to carry out the reprogramming if he docs not concur with the amendment.  
19 If one **Committee** disapproves the request and the other does not, or if the  
20 two **Committees** do not agree on any amendment to **the** request, the two **Chairmen**  
21 shall arrange a joint meeting of the two Committees to discuss their differences  
22 in an attempt to resolve them and to arrive at a solution, if possible, before  
23 **taking** final action on the request. **Notwithstanding the** procedure set forth in  
24 the preceding five sentences of **this** section, such reprogramming request may be  
25 approved by the Legislature by concurrent resolution at any time prior to the  
26 expiration of such five-day period.

1 Section 5. Administrative Guidelines. The detailed worksheets, schedules  
2 and tables submitted to the Legislature by the Governor, as modified to reflect  
3 the amounts appropriated **and allocated** in this Act, are to be used by the  
4 Director of Public Works as administrative guidelines for the purpose of  
5 allocating funds appropriated by this Act.


6 Section 6. Penalties. No funds appropriated by this Act shall be paid  
7 out of the General Fund except pursuant to the provisions of this Act. Any  
8 elected official or any officer or employee of any branch, department, agency,  
9 commission, office or instrumentality of the Government of the **Commonwealth**  
10 of the Northern Mariana Islands who shall knowingly and wilfully violate any  
11 provision of this Act shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than one  
12 thousand dollars or be imprisoned for not more than one year, or both.

13 Section 7. Severability. If any provision of this Act, or the application  
14 of any such provision to any person or circumstance, shall be held invalid by a  
15 court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act, or the application  
16 of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is  
17 held invalid, shall not be affected thereby.

18 Section 8. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval  
19 by the Governor, or upon its becoming law without such approval.




