9 Section 3. Prohibition. No obligation, expenditure, agreement
10 or contract for expenditure of Commonwealth Funds appropriated by this
11 Act shall be made for any purpose other than the purposes for which
12 the funds are appropriated and only as authorized by the Governor or
13 his designee. No funds appropriated by this Act shall be obligated,
14 encumbered or otherwise committed after September 30, 1981 excepted
15 as provided by this Act. No funds required to be reserved for a
16 Special Education Training Fund pursuant to Section 702(a) of the
17 Covenant to Establish a Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands
18 in Political Union with the United States of America shall be used
19 for any appropriation made by this Act.

20 Section 4. Transfer of Marianas/Guam Liaison Office. In the
21 event that legislation is enacted to establish a Marianas/Guam Liaison
22 Office or similar entity, within the Office of the Representative to
23 the United States, any balance remaining in the appropriations made by
24 Section 2(h) of this Act on the effective date of such legislation shall
25 be transferred to the Office of the Representative to the United States
26 as of such date.

1 Section 5. Reprogramming. No funds appropriated by this Act
2 shall, be reprogrammed or reallocated except pursuant to this section,
3 or as otherwise **provided** by law. No employee ceiling limit imposed
4 by this Act may be changed or reprogrammed except with the approval
5 of the Legislature as provided in this section. No funds shall be
6 reprogrammed other than to another item in this Act, except pursuant
7 to a reallocation or change under Article III, Section 15 of the
8 Constitution. Subject to the restrictions of this Act, the Governor
9 may reprogram funds between or among the items in this Act in any
10 amount that does not increase or decrease the amount of any such item
11 by more than twenty percent. Notice of such reprogramming shall be
12 reported **in** writing to the Chairman of the Committee on Appropriations
13 of the House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Committee on
14 Fiscal Affairs of the Senate not later than three working days after
15 the date the Governor takes such reprogramming action. If the
16 reprogramming would result in more than the percent change, cumulative
17 and in total for the fiscal year, permitted by this section, or requests
18 a change or reprogramming of any employee ceiling limit imposed by this
19 Act, the proposal shall be submitted in writing to the two Chairmen for
20 approval by the Legislature before the transfer of funds or other change
21 takes place. Such reprogramming request shall be considered approved
22 by the Legislature if it has not been disapproved by either **Committee**
23 within five calendar days from the date of its acknowledged official
24 receipt. Either Committee may propose to amend the request. If the
25 other **Committee** does not agree to such an amendment within the five-day

1 period, the request shall be considered disapproved. If the other
2 Committee agrees to the amendment, the request shall be considered
3 approved as amended, except that the Governor may choose not to carry
4 out the reprogramming if he does not concur with the amendment. If
5 one Committee disapproves the request and the other does not, or if
6 the two Committees do not agree on any amendment to the request, the
7 two Chairmen shall arrange a joint meeting of the two Committees to
8 discuss their differences in an attempt to resolve them and to arrive
9 at a solution, if possible, before taking final action on the request.
10 Notwithstanding the procedure set forth in the preceding five sentences
11 of this section, such reprogramming request may be approved by the
12 Legislature by concurrent resolution at any time prior to the
13 expiration of such five-day period.


14 Section 6. Administrative Guidelines. The detailed worksheets,
15 schedules and tables submitted to the Legislature by the Governor. as
16 modified to reflect the amounts appropriated and allocated in this
17 Act, are to be used by the Governor as administrative guidelines for
18 the purpose of allocating funds appropriated by this Act.


19 Section 7. Penalties. No funds appropriated by this Act shall
20 be paid out of the General Fund except pursuant to the provisions of
21 this Act. Any elected official or any officer or employee of any
22 branch, department, agency, commission, office or instrumentality of
23 the Government of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands who
24 shall knowingly and wilfully violate any provision of this Act shall.
25 upon conviction, be fined not more than one thousand dollars or be
26 imprisoned for not more than one year, or both.

1 Section 8. Severability. If any provision of this Act, or the
2 application of any such provision to any person or circumstance, shall
3 be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder
4 of this Act, or the application of such provision to persons or
5 circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid, shall
6 not be affected thereby.


7 Section 9. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its
8 approval by the Governor, or upon its becoming law without such approval.
