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AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$8,102,000 in Fiscal Year 1986 for Capital Improvement/Development Project funds and \$3,187,000 in other Federal construction funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE FIFTH NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

1 Section 1. Short Title. This act may be cited as the Fiscal Year  
2 1986 Capital Improvement Project Appropriation Act.

3 Section 2. Resources. Notwithstanding any requirement of the  
4 Planning and Budgeting Act of 1983, 1 CMC Div. 7 (as amended) to the  
5 contrary, the Legislature adopts the following resource identification  
6 for Capital Improvement Project funds in Fiscal Year 1986 for the  
7 following purposes and amounts:

24		Section 4. <u>Federal Funds.</u> The local appropriation of federal funds	
25		in Section 3 is contingent upon their appropriation by the federal	
26		government.	

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1           Section 5. Public Bidding and Commonwealth Contractor Preference.  
2 Unless the Governor certifies to the presiding officers of the  
3 legislature that there is an emergency, awards for the projects for which  
4 funds are appropriated by this act shall only be made after public notice  
5 and bidding. The Commonwealth shall give a preference in awarding the  
6 contracts funded by the funds appropriated in this act to Commonwealth  
7 contractors, unless a contractor who is not a Commonwealth contractor is  
8 equally qualified and submits a bid which is 20% lower than the lowest  
9 bid submitted by a responsible Commonwealth contractor. A Commonwealth  
10 contractor means any business which is not less than 75% owned by  
11 citizens of the United States, Interim U.S. citizens as defined in  
12 Section 8 of the Schedule on Transitional Matters in the Commonwealth  
13 Constitution, or lawfully admitted permanent residents.

14           Section 6. Expenditure Authority.


15                   (a) Pursuant to 1 CMC Section 7401(a) and unless  
16 otherwise specified in this section, the Governor or his  
17 designee may expend the funds appropriated in this act.

18                   (b) The Mayors of Rota and Tinian shall expend the  
19 funds appropriated by Section 3 (b) (1-2) and (c) (1,2,  
20 4-9) of this Act. The Marianas Public Land Corporation  
21 shall expend the funds appropriated by Section 3 (c) (3)  
22 of this Act; provided, however, that in the event that  
23 EDA approves CNMI Funding Application for Sinapalo Water  
24 Project under Section B(2) of this Act, said funds shall  
25 be made available for reprogramming by the Mayor and the

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
1 Rota Legislative Delegation for other priority projects  
2 on Rota in consultation with the Director of Public Works.  
2 Section 7. Effective Date. Upon its approval by the Governor, or  
4 upon its becoming law without such approval, this act shall be effective  
5 on October 1, 1985.
