H. B. No. 19-121, HD2

AN ACT

TO AMEND PUBLIC LAW 19-08, SECTION 602(B) HIRING RESTRICTIONS AND SECTION 702(D) JUDICIAL BRANCH PROBATION OFFICERS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Bill was not referred to a House Committee.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, DECEMBER 21, 2015; with amendments in the form of H. B. 19-121, HD2 and transmitted to the THE SENATE.

The Bill was not referred to a Senate Committee.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE SENATE ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, DECEMBER 23, 2015; without amendments.

H. B. 19-121, HD2 WAS RETURNED TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ON DECEMBER 23, 2015.

THE BILL WAS FINALLY PASSED ON DECEMBER 21, 2015.

AN ACT

TO **AMEND SECTION PUBLIC** LAW 19-08. 602(B) HIRING SECTION RESTRICTIONS AND 702(D) JUDICIAL BRANCH PROBATION OFFICERS: AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Nineteenth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature:

Section 1. Findings. The Legislature finds that probation officers are necessary to ensure their offenders remain supervised by the law and behave themselves. This is an important part of the criminal justice system because it requires the officer to remain committed to the offender and ensure that they do not commit another offense again. While probation only lasts a short period, there is still a lasting effect that many criminals have as a result of probation which stays with them throughout their life. Probation officers simply help with the transition from criminal back to citizen, allowing many offenders a second chance at life, rather than incarceration. For many individuals who have been convicted of a crime, probation officers are probably the bane of their existence: the people who keep them from leaving the island, checking up on them nearly every day. However, probation officers are a necessary part of our criminal justice system and serve to help rehabilitate many offenders.

Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to ensure that the Office of Adult Probation retains the two probation officers position to help make certain that offenders are held accountable for their crimes and to focus on making our victims and communities whole again.

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Section 2. <u>Amendment.</u> Section 602 (b) of Public Law 19-08 is hereby amended to ready as follows:

- "(b) In order to reduce the size of the Government, except for the Public School System, the Northern Marianas College, the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services, the Department of Finance, the law enforcement officers of Customs, Fish & Wildlife, Quarantine, CNMI Adult Probation Office, and Commerce ABTC & Enforcement Compliance Divisions, any position that becomes vacant shall be blocked if it is not filled within 90 days. Provided however, (1) if a Notice of Personnel Action has been executed by the hiring agency and a candidate to fill the vacancy has been selected or (2) an action has been initiated, including announcing a job vacancy, to fill the position by any department or agency and filed at the Office of Personnel Management in Rota, Tinian, and Saipan prior to the expiration of the 90 day requirement, the vacant position(s) shall be deemed in conformance within the 90 day requirement. The renewal of the contract for an existing employee shall not be considered creating a vacant position. Any funds realized as a result of position vacancies shall go to the Medical Referral Services, Business Unit 1979.
- **Section 3.** <u>Amendment.</u> Section 702 (d) of Public Law 19-08 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - "(d) The two probation officers funded by Federal funds for FY 2015 may be converted and funded for Probation Officers under the Judiciary personnel appropriation business unit 1690 for FY 2016 or the two new positions may be otherwise filled as new probation officers under the Judiciary personnel appropriation business unit 1690 for FY 2016."
- **Section 4.** <u>Amendment.</u> Section 709 (h) of Public Law 19-08 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - "(h) Group Health and Life Insurance. The funds earmarked to the Group Health and Life Insurance pursuant to 4 CMC § 1402(a)(16) and funds appropriated to the Group Health Insurance under business unit 1533 for the executive branch shall not be reprogrammed for any other purpose. Any lapsed funds shall be used to reduce the premium of the government group health insurance. Funds appropriated to the Group Health Insurance under business unit 1533 may be used to pay unpaid claims incurred in prior years."
- **Section 5.** <u>Severability</u>. If any of this Act or the application of any such provision in any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provision to persons or circumstance other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.
- Section 6. <u>Savings Clause</u>. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any excising right required under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulations or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers

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contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or its becoming law without such approval.
