Representative Glenn L. Maratita, of Rota, Precinct 7 (*for himself*,) in an open and public meeting with an opportunity for the public to comment, introduced the following Bill:

H. B. No. 19-62, HD1

AN ACT

TO AMEND TITLE 9 OF THE COMMONWEALTH CODE REGARDING MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSURE AND RENTAL.

The Bill was referred to the House Committee on Judiciary and Governmental Operations, which submitted Standing Committee Report 19-28; adopted September 28, 2015.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, SEPTEMBER 29, 2015; with amendments in the form of H. B. 19-62, HD1 and transmitted to the THE SENATE.

The Bill was referred to the Senate Committee on Judiciary, Government, and Law, which submitted Standing Committee Report 19-79; adopted March 11, 2016. THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE SENATE ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, MARCH 11, 2016; without amendments and was returned to THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

THE BILL WAS FINALLY PASSED ON SEPTEMBER 29, 2015.

AN ACT

TO AMEND TITLE 9 OF THE COMMONWEALTH CODE REGARDING MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSURE AND RENTAL.

Be it enacted by the Nineteenth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature:

Section 1. <u>Findings.</u> The Legislature finds that driver's education in the Commonwealth needs to be enhanced in order to promote safer operation of motor vehicles. Specifically, while tourism and immigration have greatly enriched the Commonwealth, it has provided challenges for law enforcement. In particular, visitors and immigrants are often unaccustomed to American-style traffic laws, imperiling the safety of tourists and residents alike. Furthermore, people enrolling in the driver's education course would benefit from an easy-to-use summary of the Commonwealth's traffic laws.

The Commonwealth Law Revision Commission has prepared a Driver's Handbook summarizing the traffic laws and safety practices necessary to drive in the Commonwealth. This book is available in the principal languages of residents and guest in the Commonwealth. The Legislature finds that to enhance the safety of the Commonwealth's roads, business that rent motor vehicles should be required to provide their customers with copies of the Driver's Handbook. In addition, to those who enroll in the driver's education should also be required to purchase a copy of the Handbook.

15 Section 2. <u>Amendment.</u> 9 CMC § 2413 is amended by adding subsection (c) to read
as follows:

HOUSE BILL 19-62, HD1

"(c) Each enrolled student shall purchase a copy of the most recent edition of the Driver's Handbook from the available options."

Section 3. Amendment. Title 9, Division 5, Chapter 8 of the Commonwealth Code is amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

"§ 5815. Motor Vehicle Rental Safety.

(a) No individual or business shall rent a motor vehicle to any person unless the person renting the motor vehicle is allowed to operate the vehicle pursuant to 9 CMC § 2201 or 2202.

(b) A business that provides motor vehicle rental services shall, upon registering or renewing the registration of a rental vehicle, produce a receipt showing that the business has purchased a copy of the Driver's Handbook produced by the Commonwealth Law Revision Commission in each of the languages in which it is published for the vehicle within the last 30 days. The receipt shall note the license plate number of the vehicle. If the business does not produce the receipt, the vehicle shall not be registered.

(c) A business that provides motor vehicle rental services shall provide a copy of the Driver's Handbook produced by the Commonwealth Law Revision Commission in each of the languages in which the Handbook is published with each vehicle rented. Provided further that each individual or business motor vehicle rental service shall provide a video on road safety tips for each respective renter in the respective language.

(d) Failure to provide the Driver's Handbook to a person renting a motor vehicle may constitute evidence of negligence in a civil action."

Section 3. <u>Severability.</u> If any provisions of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 4. <u>Savings Clause</u>. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation, or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.
