AN ACT

TO BAN THE IMPORTATION OF USED TIRES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Bill was referred to the House Committee on Commerce and Tourism, which submitted Standing Committee Report 19-37; adopted October 27, 2015.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, OCTOBER 27, 2015;

with amendments in the form of H. B. 19-89, HS1 and transmitted to the THE SENATE.

The Bill was referred to the Senate Committee on Judiciary, Government, and Law, which submitted Standing Committee Report 19-80; adopted March 11, 2016.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE SENATE ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, MARCH 11, 2016; without amendments and was returned to THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

THE BILL WAS FINALLY PASSED ON OCTOBER 27, 2015.

AN ACT

TO BAN THE IMPORTATION OF USED TIRES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Nineteenth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature:

Section 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Used Tire Importation Ban Act of 2015."

Section 2. Findings and Purpose. The Legislature finds that our great Commonwealth has limited land resources to accommodate the constant inflow of debris. Among such debris that flow into our dump sites and transfer stations are used tires. After such time has elapsed, the specified item must be properly disposed of. However, our dump sites are not being efficiently used due to their size constraints, and large amounts of space are required to store an item such as used tires. Therefore, action must be taken in order to decelerate the process of incoming used tires and allow for our dump sites to be used efficiently for other trash related purposes.

The Legislature finds that ongoing inflow of used tires can pose serious environmental concerns in the future. Due to their prior history and usage, the life span of these used tires is limited to a shorter amount of time which leads to a build-up of unusable tires at the transfer stations and dump sites.

The Legislature further finds that the usage of such tires can also yield serious safety concerns for motorists. Due to the used tires' prior usage, their durability and dependability

has been altered. The threading of used tires has depreciated, and can be a contributor in fatal car accidents. Therefore, a law must be enacted to prevent and deter such catastrophes from occurring.

The purpose of this Act is to implement a provision to ban the importation of used tires and prevent any environmental and safety concerns that may arise.

Section 3. <u>Amendment.</u> 6 CMC §2301(a) is hereby amended by adding a new subsection (9) to read as follows:

"(9) Used tires"

Section 4. <u>Severability.</u> If any provisions of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 5. <u>Savings Clause</u>. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation, or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor, or its becoming law without such approval.
