

AN ACT

To enable the CNMI to participate in the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education's Professional Student Exchange Program; and for other purposes.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE TWENTIETH NORTHERN MARIANAS
COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:**

1 **Section 1. Short Title.** This Act may be cited as the "CNMI Professional Student
2 Exchange Program Act of 2017."

3 **Section 2. Findings and Purpose.** The Commonwealth Legislature finds that the
4 CNMI is currently a member of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education
5 (WICHE). Membership in WICHE allows students from the CNMI to be eligible for
6 reduced tuition at more than 200 participating WICHE institutions. Moreover, CNMI
7 students under WICHE's Western Undergraduate Exchange Program (WUE) are eligible
8 to request for a reduced tuition rate of 150% of the resident tuition rate when they attend
9 one of the 159 WUE institutions instead of paying out-of-state tuition which is sometimes
10 double or more than double the resident tuition for many states. In addition, WICHE's
11 Western Regional Graduate Program enables CNMI students to select any of the 400
12 participating graduate programs and pay the enrolling institution's resident tuition rate,
13 instead of the nonresident rate that an out-of-state student would normally pay.

14 The Commonwealth Legislature does recognize that although being a member of
15 WICHE greatly benefits graduate and undergraduate students in the CNMI, students who
16 aspire to pursue post-graduate professional fields of study in the healthcare professions
17 currently do not have the necessary scholarships available in the CNMI to assist them.

1 However, the Commonwealth Legislature finds that WICHE will serve those students who
2 want to pursue a professional degree in healthcare fields such as Dentistry, Allopathic
3 Medicine, Occupational Therapy, Optometry, Osteopathic Medicine, Pharmacy, Physical
4 Therapy, Physician Assistant, Podiatry and Veterinary Medicine through WICHE's
5 Professional Student Exchange Program (PSEP). WICHE's PSEP enables students to enroll
6 in some 130 selected out-of-state professional healthcare programs and pay reduced
7 tuition. States typically fund students to enroll through PSEP if a professional healthcare
8 program is not available at one of their in-state public institutions. Through PSEP, a
9 student's home state pays a "support fee" to the receiving school to reduce the cost of the
10 student's education. Most students enrolled in public programs pay resident tuition; if the
11 support fee does not cover the difference between resident and nonresident tuition, they
12 may pay slightly more.

13 The Commonwealth Legislature further finds that in order for the CNMI to fully
14 invest in our students' education and help to bring in qualified local healthcare
15 professionals, it is essential to participate in programs such as WICHE's PSEP. Therefore,
16 the purpose of this legislation is to promote a higher level of education for our students by
17 enabling the CNMI to participate in WICHE's PSEP.

18 **Section 3. Enactment.** Subject to the codification of the CNMI Law Revision
19 Commission, the following is hereby enacted as follows.

20 "Section 101. Professional Student Exchange Program. The CNMI shall
21 participate in the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education's Professional
22 Student Exchange Program.

23 Section 102. Support Fee and Field Selection.

24 (a) The PSEP Support Fees shall be determined by the WICHE Commission.

25 (b) The CNMI WICHE Commissioners shall determine the Professional
26 Healthcare Fields of Study that the CNMI will offer assistance for in
27 collaboration with the CNMI Scholarship Office.

28 Section 103. Program Administration. The CNMI Scholarship Office shall
29 administer the PSEP scholarships and the CNMI Scholarship Administrator shall serve as

1 the certifying officer for eligible students. The CNMI Scholarship Office may promulgate
2 rules and regulations to effectively implement this chapter.

3 Section 104. Reporting. The CNMI Scholarship Office shall submit an annual
4 report to the presiding officers of the Legislature and the Governor reporting, among other
5 things, the number of students participating in the program, the number of graduates who
6 have successfully completed their Professional Healthcare Degree/Medical Degree at a
7 U.S. accredited Professional Healthcare Institution/Medical School, and the number of
8 participating students who have returned to the Commonwealth to work.

9 Section 105. Criteria and Requirements. To be eligible for this scholarship
10 program an individual must:

- 11 (1) Be a United States citizen.
- 12 (2) Be a registered CNMI voter.
- 13 (3) Be a CNMI resident for at least three consecutive years prior to enrollment in a
14 Professional Healthcare Institution/Medical School.
- 15 (4) Possess a bachelor's degree.
- 16 (5) Furnish a letter of acceptance from a U.S. accredited Professional Healthcare
17 Institution/Medical School.
- 18 (6) Agree to return to the CNMI after completion of professional field of study and
19 work in the CNMI for a period of two years for each year of scholarship
20 assistance.
- 21 (7) Agree to reimburse the CNMI of all moneys received if the student chooses to
22 switch course of studies not directly related to the approved professional
23 healthcare field of study recommended by the CNMI WICHE Commissioners.
- 24 (8) If the recipient fails to complete the program, the recipient must pay all the
25 scholarship funds received through this scholarship program. The CNMI
26 Scholarship Office Board of Directors must establish a repayment period not to
27 exceed 10 years. Default in payment shall accrue an annual interest rate of 8%.
- 28 (9) Not be a recipient for any other financial assistance funded by the CNMI
29 Scholarship Office.

1 (10) Not be a recipient of any other full scholarship programs such as the United
2 States Military Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP).”

3 **Section 4. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or the application of any such
4 provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent
5 jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or
6 circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

7 **Section 5. Savings Clause.** This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not
8 be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under
9 statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes.
10 Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant
11 to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any
12 way modifying, any liability civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence at the
13 date this Act becomes effective.


14 **Section 6. Effective Date.** This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the
15 Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.


