#### H.B. NO. 20-174

#### AN ACT

TO AMEND 1 CMC §2264 TO ENSURE THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION MEMBERS RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR COMMITTEE MEETINGS, WHICH ARE VITAL TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF POLICY AND THE FUNCTIONING OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM.

The Bill was referred not referred to a House Committee.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, JULY 31, 2018; without amendments and transmitted to the THE SENATE.

The Bill was referred to the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs.

THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE SENATE ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, SEPTEMBER 27, 2018; without amendments and was returned to THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

THE BILL WAS FINALLY PASSED ON JULY 31, 2018.

#### H. B. No. 20-174

#### AN ACT

TO AMEND I CMC \$2264 TO ENSURE THAT THE BOARD OF EDUCATION MEMBERS RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR COMMITTEE MEETINGS, WHICH ARE VITAL TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF POLICY AND THE FUNCTIONING OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM.

# Be it enacted by the Twentieth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature:

Section 1. Findings. The Legislature finds that the Board of Education uses the standing and ad hoc committee process to meet its Constitutional and statutory mandates to exercise control over, and establish policy for, the Public School System (PSS). Furthermore, Board members spend a considerable amount of time working to support PSS and the educational services provided to our children. Their time and effort must, at least, be acknowledged through the minimal honorarium established by law. To address such concerns, House Bill 20-96 was passed by the Legislature in the form of House Bill 20-96, Senate Draft 1. The specified legislation was subsequently transmitted to the Governor. However, pursuant to Governor's Communication 20-177, the Governor vetoed the proposed legislation due to the fact that it did establish a rate as to how much the respective board members were to be compensated. Furthermore, the Legislature further finds that under

Article VII, Section 8 of the Board of Education By-laws establishes rates for Board members' compensation for meetings. The Legislature finds that the amounts set forth in the specified By-law are adequate in compensating these board members for the amount of hard work that they exert to ensure that the Public School System (PSS) is operating efficiently and effectively. Therefore, the proposed legislation aims to address the concerns brought up by the Governor and allow for our Board members to be compensated justly.

#### Section 2. Amendement, 1 CMC §2264 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- "(a) Members of the Board may receive compensation for meetings attended at a rate consistent with Commonwealth law. A member who is employed by any branch or agency of the Commonwealth government shall receive his or her regular salary under administrative leave status in lieu of compensation for meetings held during working hours.
- (b) Board members may also receive administrative leave or compensation for Board of Education committee meetings attended at a rate consistent with Commonwealth law in the same manner as regular board meetings; provided that board members shall not be compensated for more than three committee meetings each month. Notwithstanding 1 CMC § 9902(d), for purposes of this section, standing committee and subcommittee meetings are compensable.
- (c) A member traveling on official business shall receive travel and per diem compensation at rates and guidelines established for Public School System employees. All payments for compensation for travel and expenses to the members of the board shall be paid by warrants signed by the Chairman of the Board of Education."
- **Section 3.** <u>Severability.</u> If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.
- **Section 4.** Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers

contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence at the date this Act becomes effective.

**Section 5.** <u>Effective Date</u>. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
